2011 NZCA Academic Awards Applications

Your son or daughter may be eligible for an academic award. You should already have received forms via email, provided:

- You have up to date membership of the Otago Southland Chinese Association (2010 – 2011).
- We have an up to date email address on our database

There are a number of criteria for eligibility:

- a. Have studied in a New Zealand secondary school for the last three years.
- b. Be of Chinese descent
- c. Be a permanent resident of New Zealand.
- d. Be under 20 years of age on 1 January of the year following the completion of their secondary school education
- e. Have been a member of, or be the daughter or son of a person who has been member of a branch of the New Zealand Chinese Association for more than twelve months at application closing date

As time is needed to obtain the required documents (e.g. JP certified results, school headmaster or dean

testimonials, etc.) as requested in the forms, candidates are advised to apply early.

There are three types of awards:

- NCEA (Level 3 or 4) Chinese Award
- NZCA Tertiary Scholarship Awards
- National Certificate of Education Achievement Awards

All awards are based on 2010 Examination Results.

NCEA (Level 3 or 4) Chinese Award

The main objective of the National Certificate of Education Achievement (NCEA Level 3 or 4) Chinese award is to promote the Chinese language.

This Chinese Award has a value of \$250 and is awarded annually to a student who sat the NCEA, Level 3 or 4 Examination in Chinese in the previous year (2010) and obtained the highest Level, grade and number of credits, if any.

NZCA Tertiary Scholarship Awards

There will be up to three NZCA (NCEA Level 4) Tertiary scholarships awarded annually, each having a value of \$750, to students who have completed their secondary education to the University Entrance level, in order to assist with their tertiary education.

National Certificate of Education Achievement Awards

NCEA (Level 1) or Cambridge International Examination (IGCSE)

Each Award will have a value of \$250. Up to five awards will be given out, one award to each of five students provided each student has attained a satisfactory standard of NCEA Level 1 or IGCSE examinations in the previous year (2010).
